Beehive is the ideal location for your Girl Scouts' first overnight camp experience. The traditional farmhouse includes two levels. On the main floor is the well-equipped kitchen, one bathroom and shower, four bedrooms outfitted with bunks, and lounge area. A fireplace offers a warm glow on chilly nights at camp. Beehive's full basement offers additional gathering space for group activities. The basement is also the sheltering location in the event of severe weather. Beehive comfortably accommodates up to 18 campers. Outside the house are trails through the nearby forest, a grassy play area and a fire ring. Beehive is open year-round and a pleasant 20-minute hike to Hilltop and Lake Brandenburg.

Girl Scouts always leave a place better than we found it. You are responsible for any damage to buildings or grounds that happen as a result of your stay.

Land Acknowledgement

The Girl Scouts of Wisconsin-Badgerland honor the special connection between the land and Indigenous peoples. A land acknowledgment is a way of showing respect to the original people who have lived on and cared for this land for thousands of years. We recognize that our camps and communities are located on the ancestral lands of the Fox, Ho-Chunk, Kickapoo, Myaamia, Peoria, Sauk, and other Indigenous nations and tribes.

Acknowledging the land is important because it helps us remember the history, culture, and contributions of these nations and show respect for Indigenous communities, including our First Nation and Indigenous Girl Scouts, volunteers, families, and communities. At camp, Girl Scouts will have a chance to learn more about Indigenous history and traditions through activities and stories, deepening our understanding and appreciation for the land we share. If you want to learn more, we encourage you to ask questions, read books about Indigenous history and culture, and attend local events. Showing respect and learning from others are important parts of being a Girl Scout!

- Shower and tub
- Rustic back up toilet and sink in basement

- Barn is restricted


Basement
