Forest Glen is a rustic camp nestled off the main trail surrounded by towering trees. The site includes five canvas tents and two cabins. The tents are erected on wooden platforms, and each tent contains four cots with mattresses on which four campers can comfortably sleep. The cabins have two sets of wooden bunk beds and a pair of cots and mattresses, and each can house six campers. At the center of Forest Glen is a covered patio for dining or crafts, and enclosed Art and Nature Center with a wood-burning fireplace. Latrines, or lalas as we call them in Girl Scouts, are located nearby. Forest Glen is a terrific space for campers looking for a more traditional outdoor camping experience.

Girl Scouts always leave a place better than we found it. You are responsible for any damage to buildings or grounds that happen as a result of your stay.

### **Land Acknowledgement**

The Girl Scouts of Wisconsin-Badgerland honor the special connection between the land and Indigenous peoples. A land acknowledgment is a way of showing respect to the original people who have lived on and cared for this land for thousands of years. We recognize that our camps and communities are located on the ancestral lands of the Fox, Ho-Chunk, Kickapoo, Myaamia, Peoria, Sauk, and other Indigenous nations and tribes.

Acknowledging the land is important because it helps us remember the history, culture, and contributions of these nations and show respect for Indigenous communities, including our First Nation and Indigenous Girl Scouts, volunteers, families, and communities. At camp, Girl Scouts will have a chance to learn more about Indigenous history and traditions through activities and stories, deepening our understanding and appreciation for the land we share. If you want to learn more, we encourage you to ask questions, read books about Indigenous history and culture, and attend local events. Showing respect and learning from others are important parts of being a Girl Scout!

- Large round tables and chairs for crafting
- Weather radio located by landline

## Cabin Units

- 2 wood cabins across from the shelter
- Each cabin sleeps 6 people in bunk beds
- Cabins available year round

## Tent Units

- 5 large canvas tents on wooden platforms across from the shelter
- Each tent sleeps 4 people
- Tents available May 1-October 15, weather permitting
- Mosquito nets provided

## Outside

- Large program area with electricity
- Fire circle
- Firewood (shed next to fire circle)
- Benches
- Water hydrant on side of building
- Washstand and drinking fountain
- 4 pit toilets or lalas

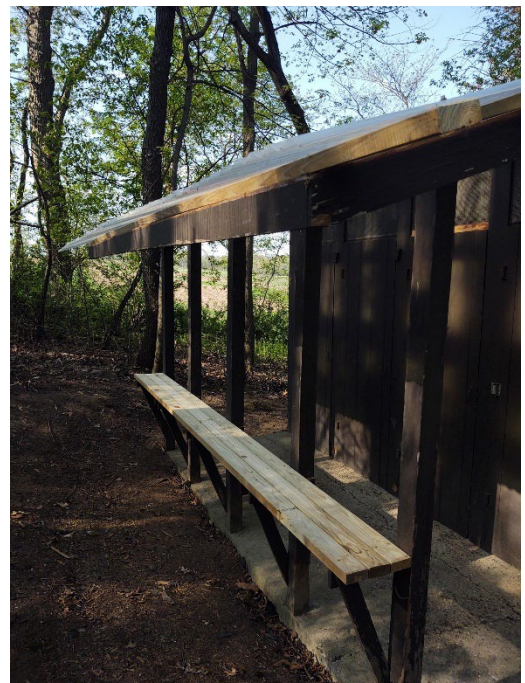
