

Cookie program powers leadership and learning

In 2024, Badgerland Girl Scouts sold an outstanding 1,350,927 boxes of cookies, demonstrating the entrepreneurial spirit, goal-setting, and determination of members across our council. Through participation in the Cookie Program, Girl Scouts developed essential skills in money management, communication, and leadership—lessons that will serve them for life.

This year, 576 top sellers who each sold more than 600 boxes were celebrated at a special VIP Day at camp. Among them was Willow Wales, a 5th grader from Janesville, who sold 7,214 boxes—earning the title of Top Seller in both Badgerland and the entire state of Wisconsin.

Proceeds from cookie sales stay local and directly fund troop activities, outdoor experiences, community service, and innovative programs that help Girl Scouts grow with courage, confidence, and character.

Thanks to the generosity of cookie customers and supporters, Girl Scouts across Badgerland are discovering their power to lead and succeed.

We expanded our reach by deepening partnerships with organizations across our council, delivering high-quality programs rooted in the Girl Scout Leadership Experience.

- 20 community partners offered hands-on, badge-earning opportunities in STEM, skilled trades, the arts, outdoor adventure, and life skills.
- We launched a new Community Connections Database, making it easier for families and troop leaders to find council-approved, vetted partners.
- Every partner meets our strict safety, inclusivity, and program quality standards, ensuring each experience is trusted and meaningful.
- In MY24, partner-led programs grew by 15%, allowing us to reach more Girl Scouts in more communities—while cutting down on travel time and keeping costs lower for membership.

- 7 out of 10 volunteers return year over year, building continuity and deeper troop experiences.
- 1,300 active volunteers led troops, mentored youth, delivered programs, and kept the Girl Scout spirit thriving.
- Volunteers led more than 80% of all Girl Scout experiences this year.
- Service unit leadership retention rate is at 97%, an unmatched statistic nationwide.

A New Home for Leadership

Improving Offerings and Access for La Crosse Area Girl Scouts

In 2024, we opened a new Leadership Center in La Crosse, expanding access to Girl Scout experiences for hundreds of local Girl Scouts. Conveniently located near 14 schools and major highways, the new space features flexible meeting areas, a Girl Scout retail shop, and a future STEM Innovation Lab.

This modern, welcoming hub allows us to host troop meetings, council-led programs, and events seven days a week-bringing more opportunities directly to the community.







Responsible Financial Stewards

Girl Scouts in Action breaks down barriers for kids in under-resourced areas, offering afterschool and community-based programming in partnership with schools and community organizations. These are not traditional troops, but dynamic, staff-led troops that bring the core Girl Scout experience directly to where kids already live and learn.

Shirley's vision and foresight helps make this possible. Her legacy gift allowed us to dream bigger, act faster, and reach deeper into communities where youth are eager for opportunity but face systemic challenges.


